A three color screen print inspired by the screenprinters at the Landmark Project;



A fun ceramic series inspired by artist Liv Antonecchia;



TWEEN/TEEN ART RETREAT: AGES 11-UP \$310.00

Projects will include a variety of media and materials. Ceramics, sculpture, painting, printmaking (including prototypes) are just a few techniques we will explore.
